

Eliminating Symptoms on Body Exterior: Cleaning Tailpipe Cover(s) on Exhaust System - Dirt on Tailpipe Cover (SY 08/11)

General information

Symptom

Tailpipe trim(s) on exhaust system are dirty.

There is a possibility that dirt on the tailpipe trim(s) may be mistaken as corrosion.

Information

The tailpipe covers on the exhaust system are sealed with a **Nano coating**.

⇒ In the event of a complaint relating to **dirty tailpipe covers**:

- **Clean off** loose dirt using **clean water** and a clean **sponge** and then
- Polish the tailpipe covers using a clean cloth and suitable **Porsche paint polish**.

⇒ **The tailpipe covers on the exhaust system must not be replaced because they are dirty.**

Tools and materials

- Sponge
- Clean, lint-free cloth
- Porsche paint polish
